When you first enter Ikea, you'll see a stack of tape measure and pencils and notepads available. These are free for you to use while you shop at IKEA. Every IKEA store has a team of furniture consultants who know a lot about their products and design. You will make a free hour appointment with a furniture consultant who will help you plan your next project and order everything you need. Fill out a short form and IKEA will send you a free IKEA catalogue filled with their products. This is a great way to take a look at what they have to offer and make a shopping list before you visit. You won't find anything too provocative at the opening of the IKEA Museum on June 30 in Älmhult, IKEA's IKEA's Sweden hometown. But for IKEA fans, it's a trove of artifacts and furniture tracing the company's 73-year history and evolution. The museum is located in what was once Ikea's first store, and it features many of the usual suspects. The Billy bookshelf and Klippan sofa-the two most produced IKEA items ever-have special installations. A series of period rooms full of IKEA furniture and accessories from the archives (complete with ten year-accurate computers, magazines and ephemera). The curators strove for historical fidelity-nothing was reproduced or reissued for the rooms-and put out a call for entries to obtain certain pieces from clients they did not have themselves. Even the humble meatball (which has had its fair share of controversy over the years) gets the gallery treatment. The most rabid fans can also take a selfie in a set done as the cover of an IKEA catalog. In recent years, the company has made efforts to increase the credibility of the design, bring more customers into the fold (the brand sees its 800 million customers in 2015 as just a drop in the bucket compared to the world population of 7 billion), and trying to difish the stereotype that the brand only sells cheap, mass-marketable design. The museum gives IKEA a place to tell its story exactly as it pleases. But it leaves some of the dark chapters of IKEA's history (as far as I could tell on a recent space tour, which is still under construction): Kamprad's alleged Nazi ties, the company's logging practices, and more. The museum is part of a larger push to turn Älmhult into a tourist destination. IKEA is also overhauling and expanding its hotel to accommodate more visitors. It's unclear how many people are actually flocking to a sleepy, remote town in Sweden for a crash course in IKEA's design history, but those who do will get their eye on one of the most recognized, if perhaps least-understood- modern brands. After completing (and surviving!) my first trip, I realized that shopping at IKEA isn't as stressful as its being paired. With the right tips, it can actually be kind of enjoyable. During my first trip to IKEA, I followed the pre-made path and took the time to catch up on some of my favorite podcasts. And because you have a shopping list, you can zip through all the irrelevant departments. They say a picture is worth more than a thousand words- and a quick snap of your favorite IKEA products is no exception. With so many options to choose from, shopping at IKEA can be incredibly overwhelming and that's where your smartphone comes in. If you see something you like in one of the model rooms, go ahead and take a quick photo. Thanks to your Kodak moments, you can get your favorite pieces out of a lineup. Before you start adding your favorite pieces to your yellow and blue shopping bag, you can swipe through all your snaps to make sure your choices go along well. We believe that your home should be a direct reflection of your personal style. Sure, very few people want their space to look like a page in the latest IKEA catalog, but you the store's model rooms to inform your shopping strategy. You see, IKEA has a talent for creating large model rooms for any type of design style, so it's in your best interest to pay attention to rooms that cater to your aesthetic. Even if you already have a few plates at home, you might as well stock up on a large bundle. Chances are, you'll wind up breaking some records and need to stock up on them anyway. My biggest regret of my first IKEA experience? Skip the Bistro. It's no secret IKEA's restaurant has a delicious menu ranging from macaroni and cheese, frozen yogurt, to (of course!) Swedish meatballs. Plus, I could have used a pick-me-up after aimlessly walking around IKEA for what felt like an eternity. It's okay, I'll save the taste test for next time.
